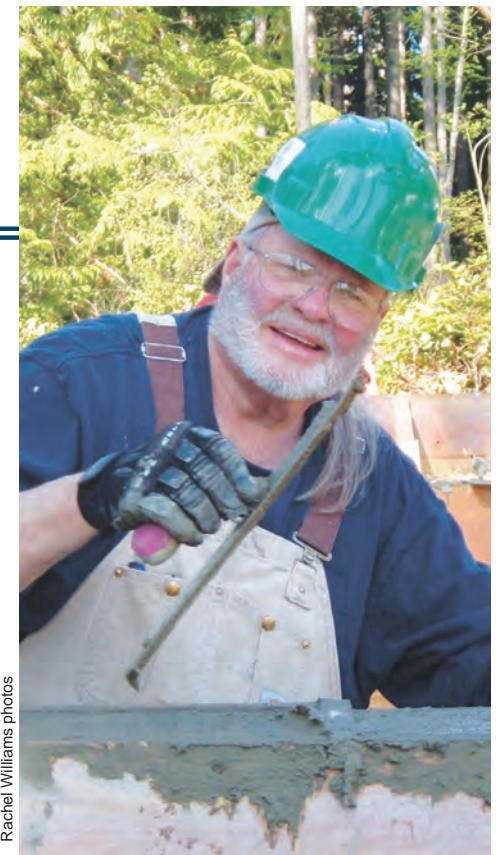

# Communities Need Affordable Housing

Affordable housing remains a critical need in our area. Jefferson County contains over 1,000 units of substandard housing. This means they lack complete plumbing or kitchen facilities, are overcrowded, or cost more than 30 percent of a family's income.

Affordable housing plays a critical role in keeping young families here. A family must earn \$32,300 annually in order to afford a two-bedroom apartment at the current Fair Market Rent of \$800 in Jefferson County. At minimum wage, that requires a 73-hour work week. For a family with two wage earners, that might be possible, but how would a single parent manage?

The news is worse for larger families. With a three-bedroom apartment renting for \$1,175, a family with minimum-wage earners must work 106 hours per week.

# Habitat Recycles Affordable Houses!

When Habitat homeowners **Robbie and Larissa Spafford** made the decision earlier this year to move to Oregon, Habitat's board of directors jumped at the chance to buy back the two-bedroom house and recycle it for a new family.

In a tough economy, recycling a house saves both money and time and helps to keep our mission sustainable. That's because ***we write each mortgage to give Habitat the first right of repurchase and keep houses affordable for us to buy back.***

Built by volunteers in 2001 on property donated by the RoseWind Co-housing Community in Port Townsend, the two-bedroom house proved a blessing to its first owners. The hard decision to move was made easier for Robbie and Larissa, knowing another Habitat family would buy it after them.

## A Family, a Recycled House and a New Life...

When Holly Varah applied to build and purchase a house in 2008, she and her two daughters were living in terrible conditions. Euphemistically referred to as 'living off the grid,' they had no electricity or indoor plumbing. Though she worked full-time as a waitress, that was what she could afford.

Habitat's supporters rallied and the board of directors took advantage of the availability of another Habitat house to recycle it for Holly and her daughters. (See accompanying article)

By mid-summer of 2009 Holly had completed more than 400 hours of "sweat equity" helping to build other Habitat houses, attending classes to prepare for home ownership, and working on her own house.

On a beautiful Sunday in August, the Varah family received the keys to their new home at a moving and joyous re-dedication ceremony. There was hardly a dry eye among the many who attended, including Holly's grandmother who flew in from Alaska to surprise her.

Asked how the family was enjoying the house, she said, "It's incredible! We're having a blast! Habitat changed my life!"

## Habitat Builds Green

HFHEJC made progress toward "green building" in 2009 with innovations in framing, flooring, paint usage, and landscaping.

These techniques mean less wood use and lower costs to the home buyer. Laminate and linoleum floor coverings reduce off-gassing common with carpet and vinyl, and low-VOC paints reduce asthma and allergies.

Many thanks to landscape professional **John Barr**, who donated his expertise to lead volunteers installing rain gardens on 21st Street. These trenched gardens and plantings help contain run-off and preserve groundwater.

Thanks also to Habitat homeowner **Darin Vercoe** (2005) for leading the efforts to improve landscaping for the houses without significantly increasing costs!
