Like many HFHEJC volunteers, Ken Evans was looking for a worthwhile project after he and his wife Kitty retired to Port Ludlow four years ago. A Boston native, he’d lived in the Seattle area for 27 years and had volunteered briefly on a Habitat project in Bellevue.

Ken has become a regular on the construction site, often volunteering once a week -- when he and Kitty aren’t visiting family -- even in the January cold. He’s also helped with office repair projects and special events, and serves on the Habitat Safety Committee. In addition, he contrib-

utes to the Port Ludlow Players as a set builder and plays senior league softball – he recruited Site Supervisor Chuck Thrasher for his team.

Ken credits retired professionals, including Chuck and Hugh Winn, for keeping “amateurs like myself” on the “straight path” toward quality building and fun.

“There are easy and hard ways to do things,” Ken said. “I’ve learned quite a bit of the tricks of the trade.” For instance, Chuck taught him the simple method of turning the hammer claw sideways when removing a nail, instead of pulling straight up or down.

“I get a kick out of things on the site,” he said. “Every day is different. That makes it interesting.”
