



Transforming Lives in South County

 David Flodstrom, Chairman of the Board, First Federal Community Foundation Since 2012 Habitat has completed 21 repairs in Quilcene and Brinnon, ranging from ramps and exterior maintenance to roof replacements and heating upgrades. Homeowners repay Habitat for the cost of their project with a no-interest, sliding-scale loan, spread into affordable monthly payments. They also invest "sweat equity" toward the project; this can take the form of actually helping with the project, providing refreshments for volunteers, working in the Quilcene Habitat Store, or spreading the word about the repair program in the community.

Repairs would not be possible without the volunteers who staff the Quilcene Store. Their hard work raises funds to support projects and many also contribute their time making repairs to homes. In addition to First Federal Community Foundation, we thank partners REPAH (Real Estate Professionals for Affordable Housing) for providing individual grants to select homeowners and the Boeing Bluebills for contributing their time and skills to Habitat's repair program.

BARBARA'S REPAIR

hen the aged siding on her home began to break down, Barbara's remote location made it difficult to find help to make necessary repairs. Habitat volunteers from all over the county spent over 300 hours making exterior repairs to Barbara's Quilcene home during the summer of 2017. Siding and framing materials to rebuild the exterior of the home were supported by a grant from REPAH. Thinking about how the project unfolded, Barbara says she felt the presence of God in both the timing and the generosity of the people involved. "It happened to come serendipitously, at the right time."

Habitat made my house a home

ate is a self-described "busy lady." Between making potholders and jewelry for local craft shows, sewing quilts for fellow cancer survivors, volunteering at the Brinnon food bank, and writing historical novels, she "doesn't know what it means to sit down."

Getting work done became difficult when she had to avoid her family room/craft room because the heat from her wood stove insert didn't reach downstairs. Periodic brownouts were frightening reminders that the house's electrical system was dangerously out-of-date and posed a fire hazard. With help from Habitat her home now has an updated electrical system, improved insulation, and an energy-efficient heat pump.

If you think these improvements might have tempted her to take a wellearned rest, you don't know Kate. Instead, they inspired a flurry of home-improvement projects of her own, such as repainting the interior of the home. She is delighted that Habitat's work has "added decades of longevity to the house," enabling her to stay in the community she cares about so much: "I love living here. There are so few of us—we depend on each other to keep things going...I love helping at the food bank. I want to do it as long as I can walk and move."

Kate's gratitude to Habitat is tied to her own ethic of service. "After all the charity work I've done and helping people, to have someone do something like this for me really means so much."




