Troy Dalton was born in Sweetwater, Texas in 1952. He grew up near Billings, Montana. Troy earned a master of fine arts degree at University of California at Davis after having earned a master's degree in art at University of Wyoming in 1981. He later taught figure drawing and painting at UC Davis, CSU Chico, American River College, San Francisco City College, and Woodland Community High School. In 2007, the Crocker Art Museum in Sacramento honored him with a special exhibition. He also served on the board of the Center for Contemporary Art, Sacramento.

He is a former professor of painting and drawing at Arizona State University in Tempe, where he taught for 27 years. Earl Linderman's art is known internationally and is held by many museums and private collections.

Graciela Rodo (born 1935 in La Paz) is a Bolivian multi-media artist. She is noted for her artworks featuring stylized renderings of children. In 1979, UNICEF designated her as the official artist for the International Year of the Child poster, and two of her tapestries now hang in the hall of the UN General Assembly.

Size: 45H X 39W

This is an original early 19th century oil of a “Scottish Gentleman”. It has been in the same local family since 1963. It was acquired at auction in Portland Oregon and was sourced from Scotland (near Edinburgh) by the auctioneer the previous year. The donor of the work will be available on the first day of the Art Show to discuss the piece with any prospective buyer. There is some damage to the plaster work on the frame.
