Building Momentum

Twenty-four years ago, just a year after becoming a Habitat for Humanity affiliate, we dedicated the first house to Christie, our very first homeowner. Through financial stability, made possible by prudent choices and an affordable mortgage, she credits Habitat with empowering her to lay a foundation for life. Since becoming a homeowner, Christie has successfully raised her children as a single mother, while progressing professionally as a military veteran, college graduate, and public servant.

Fast-forward thirteen years to 2012 and the historic dedication of the **25th Habitat EJC house**. Homeowner Hillary was also able to build on the financial stability that her home afforded her. Independent by 2020, she sold it back to Habitat - so that it could be made available to another Habitat family.

The pivotal **50th Habitat house** was quietly sold during the pandemic shutdown in 2020, with sound results. Moving into an affordable house and establishing stability allowed Ingrid and her daughter to prevail safely and securely at home.

This appreciable momentum is a clear reflection of the generosity and commitment of our growing community, and your willingness to invest time and money in permanently affordable housing to solve our local housing crisis.

Construction Update

In September we completed the six homes at Landes North. These homes stand for the generosity of our community through volunteer hours and in-kind donations, contributed cash, and donated talent.

Each home was sponsored by an individual, group, or organization. Heartfelt appreciation and gratitude go to the **Dream Weaver Foundation**, the **Habitat Board & Board Alumni**, the "Truck Guys" and their spouses, the Estate of Ted Rogers (and his family), and the Cross Charitable Foundation. Their generosity bridges a significant gap to cover the cost of building these six homes.



When combined with the permanent-affordability policy that Habitat EJC has instituted, and the affordable mortgage taken on by our partners – it is our **volunteers**, **donors**, and **sponsors** who stand out – as **the key** to the six new homes at Landes North.

More appreciation goes to the donors whose substantial generosity underwrote the land purchase and infrastructure needed for building these homes: **First Fed Foundation**, the **L.S. (Sam) Shoen Foundation**, **SiteWise (Marc Errichetti)**, **Terrapin Architects (Richard Berg)**, and several anonymous donors.

To Mason Street and Beyond!

In 2022, Habitat EJC and the Jefferson Community Foundation (JCF) joined forces to secure ownership of a 17-acre land parcel in Port Hadlock, Washington. This pioneering and cooperative venture has garnered noteworthy attention for Habitat EJC. Our story was recognized by Habitat for Humanity International as significant, given our size and location and chosen from among 1,100 affiliate organizations to tell our story. Executive Director, Jamie Maciejewski delivered a presentation titled "From Zero to 150 at Warp Speed: How One Habitat Is Responding to its Community's Bold Ambitions" sharing the core element to the success of this project: cultivating extensive community relationships and demonstrating a history of achievements.
